

Advent is here! This ancient series of holy days celebrates not only the expected arrival of Christ as Christmas but Jesus' triumphant return when we will all rise up to meet him. The word, advent simply means "the coming or arrival of something or someone significant."

An All-Church bible study using the book *When God Comes Down* will begin for some the last week of November to get in all four weeks before Christmas. Some studies will combine the last two weeks as they will run into Christmas week. The Christmas Day chapter will be celebrated on Christmas Eve.



MISSION OUTREACH ADVENT OFFERING – 2024

Dear FUMC Church Family,

As we begin this beautiful season of Advent and look forward to celebrating God's greatest gift to us, Jesus Christ, let us make this waiting time richer by shining the light of God's love on others! This year we will be supporting UMCOR US Disaster Response and Recovery and remembering forgotten elderly friends with special gifts just for them.

The United Committee on Relief, UMCOR, was founded in 1940 by Bishop Herbert Welch, in response to displaced and vulnerable populations in the wake of WW II. It was created to be "the voice of conscience among Methodists to act in the relief of human suffering without distinction to race, color or creed." That mandate is true to this day. UMCOR responds to natural or civil disasters of such magnitude that they overwhelm a community's ability to recover on their own. Through UMCOR, United Methodists extend loving care to people within the United States.

When disasters strike, such as hurricanes, it is local churches that provide the first response to their communities with training, financial assistance, expertise and community collaboration. As folks begin to recover from these catastrophic storms, UMCOR has been on the ground in these areas helping with clean-up, removing debris, tarping roofs and cleaning out homes in hard hit areas. 100% of our gifts are used for responding to disasters.

This year we are making a special effort to remember ten elderly people in need of Christmas love. We are calling this "Remembering the Forgotten." This year we will provide special gifts to seniors who do not have the support of a loving family. These recipients will be selected with care by Pastor Yolanda through contacts in the community. The gifts will be generous, and unique for each special individual. The gifts will be wrapped and accompanied by a card. We hope to generate some new friends and happy hearts!

We thank you in advance for your gifts. May your Advent season be filled with the light and love of God's greatest blessings, Jesus Christ.

MITTEN TREE – DECORATE WITH LOVE!




