

PASTORAL THOUGHTS: JANUARY 2024

January 6th signals a change in church seasons. Advent melded in Christmastide, and Christmastide blossoms into Epiphany. The Merriam-Webster dictionary offers these definitions of the word: "a divine revelation" or "a divine appearance or manifestation." The term Epiphany can highlight a "divine communication of truth." All of these were true when the Wisemen/Kings, also called Magi, appeared at the manger. They added another dimension to the birth of Jesus. Not only are angels and the common folk worshipping but so are the powerful and the wealthy. The angels gave what they were created to provide, honor, and glory to God. The shepherds and the family, whose home Mary and Joseph were invited to stay, gave out of their poverty. 
TRUSTEES UPDATE

The Trustees would like to share an update regarding some new efforts that are underway. FUMC and Rainbow, sharing the cost have expanded the security system in and around the building with additional cameras that can be accessed by phone so that if no one is in the office, someone can be identified and given access to entry. Interior areas that previously had no camera visibility are now more secure for those in the building. There is now electronic handicapped access to the parking lot outer door, with the interior door being left in the open position during times when there are services and meetings. Come join us in the lounge, or join us by Zoom.


MEN'S BIBLE STUDY

Stepping Stone Emergency Housing Special Mission for January

With the onset of our winter weather, it is uplifting to discover a place that offers shelter and a compassionate way to help homeless individuals! Stepping Stone Emergency Housing in Anoka provides shelter and basic needs and programs for individuals 18 and older. Stepping Stone seeks to bring education and solutions

as part of their homeless response. Residents who stay at Stepping Stone are required to have an individual goal plan with a case manager, getting at the root cause of their homelessness, which may include lack of education, need for employment, finding affordable housing and making positive personal decisions. Residents must meet with their case manager and comply with all rules and regulations and complete all assigned chores. There is a maximum capacity of 6 men and 4 women on any given day. They are assigned to a room with a bed and linens, take showers and are given grooming items. Three nutritious meals are served each day. There is a laundry facility, and clothing is provided when needed. Staff members are committed to treating all individuals with dignity and respect. Here is a quote from Karen Evenson, pastor of Anoka UMC, "Stepping Stone is an excellent organization, and is very worthy of your support. Their director, Steve Griffiths, is a good friend of mine. He and the entire staff are committed to compassionate, quality care." Our heartfelt thanks in advance for supporting this worthy mission with your prayers and gifts.
